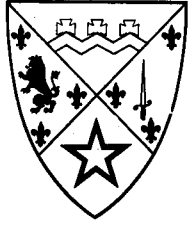

Top Three Students Speak At Graduation Ceremonies

The Reverend William Anson, C.S.V., announces **Pam Madsen, Richard Evans, and Karen Hoefling** as valedictorian and salutatorians of the Class of 1964. Selected on the basis of their grade point averages of 3.71, 3.67, and 3.67 respectively, these students will build their valedictory and salutatory speeches on the theme of Nevada's Centennial. The speeches will be presented at the graduation breakfast June 2.

In her speech, Pam, valedictorian, strives to apply the principles brought out in Emerson's essay on "Self Reliance." She hopes to illustrate how these principles apply to the pioneers of yesterday as well as the "pioneers" of tomorrow.

She has chosen to continue education at the University of California, in Berkeley, where she will major in Math. Hoping to become a college-level math instructor, Pam is presently taking courses as an NSU "selected senior" in Calculus, Analytic Geometry, and Probability, a total of ten college credits.

Although her studies keep her quite busy, Pam participates in extra-curricular activities including: GAA, majorette, French Club, Chemistry, class plays, and variety shows.

Richard Evans, salutatorian, plans to major in chemistry at either the University of Nevada, Reno, or Arizona State University. In his years at Gorman, Richard acquired the honors of: English award, 2-3; Spanish award, 2; American history award, 3; World History award, 1; NEDT award, 1-2; and was selected as the Optimist Club Student-of-the-Month in February, 1964.

Presently a member of the Clark County Teenage Council, Richard has served on the Archive staff for four years and is this year's Organization-Activities Editor.

Also this year's salutatorian, Karen Hoefling, who will attend Colorado State University, plans to major in dietetics. After college she will pursue a career in the same. Last year Karen represented Gorman at Girls State and this year at the Governor's Youth Safety Council in Reno.

By participating in Pep Club and Spanish Club, and by working on the Archive in addition to her scholastic pursuits, Karen manages to keep busy. However, she still finds time to engage in her hobbies: sewing, reading, and tennis.

148 seniors from the class of '64 will receive diplomas at the graduation exercises on June 2nd at 7:30 p.m. in the Gorman auditorium. The Baccalaureate ceremonies will officially begin at a High Mass which will be celebrated in St. Viator's Guardian Angel Shrine by the Reverend William Anson, C.S.V., at 10:30 a.m. Music for the Mass will be provided by the Gorman High School Glee Club, under the direction of Sister Donna Maria, C.S.C.

Following the mass, a baccalaureate brunch for the graduates and their parents and friends will take place in the Congo Room of the Sahara Ho-

tel at 12:00 noon. Father Anson, principal, will act as master of ceremonies for the brunch, and the speakers will include: valedictorian, Pam Madsen; salutatorians, Richard Evans and Karen Hoefling; student council president, Gary Fowler; and senior class president, David Barraza. The presentation of academic awards and scholarships will also be made by Father Anson, to outstanding seniors in the graduating class.

In 1954, when Gorman first opened, it had only one small row of classrooms, no chapel, no graduating class, and a small but dedicated faculty. Among these original teachers was Brother Joseph Drolet, C.S.V.

This year the school is ten years old. Also this year Brother Drolet is completing his tenth year at Gorman. He is the only teacher in the school who has been here since it opened.

Brother has not only witnessed the many improvements at Gorman, but has helped many of them materialize.

By far the most impressive of Brother's accomplishments is the Gorman band. Two years ago, responding to the student's call for a new school band, Brother Drolet started with a few relatively untrained musicians. At the band's first concert, the gasps of amazement and the thunderous applause, were an indication of what Brother could do in a few short months.

The two towering antennae on the roof represents another project of Brother Drolet's. He operates a large ham radio outfit, through which he is able to contact the missions and friends of the Viatorian Community.

One could mention many more of Brother's activities: The Variety Shows, the language clubs, the stage sets, sound, and lighting; but most important of all, Brother Drolet serves as an example of what a person in the religious life should be.

Next to the drawbridge stood a huge stone containing the sword. The inscription read, "he who pulleth this sword from its stone is born king of Camelot."

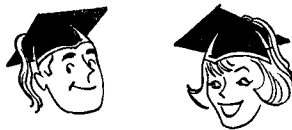
The king, with First Attendant Gary Fowler and Second Attendant Larry Swanson, ruled from a throne of red velvet cascading from a glittering silver crown.

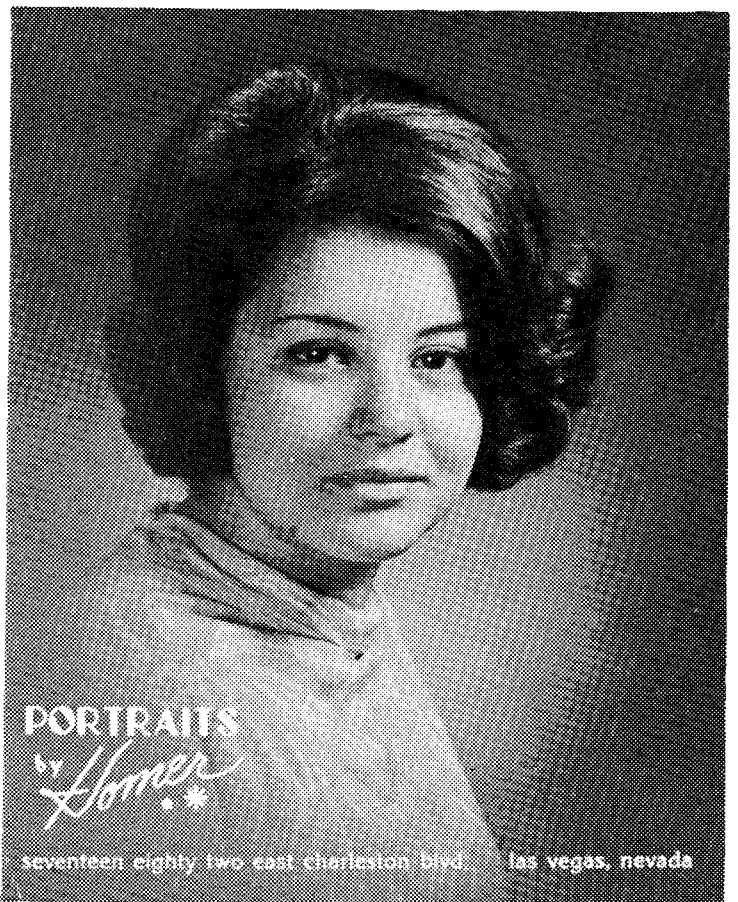
Mauriello Chosen Student-Of-Month

Doug DuCharme, high-scoring center for the Gorman Gaels, was recently named to the Catholic New World All-American Basketball team.

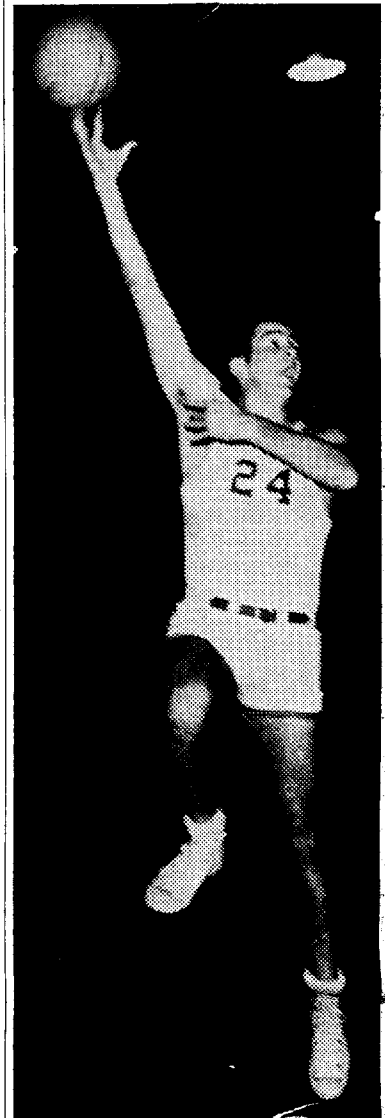
In the annual poll by the New World, Catholic publication for the arch-diocese of Chicago, DuCharme was named 27th member on the fifth team All-American squad.
